Development of Sports Fishing Harbours in the Maldives

A First-Mover Opportunity in Marine Recreation and Blue Economy Infrastructure

TThe Government of Maldives invites investors to participate in the development of the country's first-ever sports fishing marinas. With a fast-growing interest in recreational fishing and a thriving tourism base of over 170 resorts and 150 safari vessels, the Maldives is poised to become a premium destination for sportfishing tourism in the Indian Ocean.

This project offers the opportunity to build and operate full-service sports fishing harbours with mooring, logistics, and hospitality facilities, tailored to international anglers, safari operators, and guesthouse visitors. Designated five marina zones across the country offer calm waters year-round, ease of access, and proximity to established tourist infrastructure.

Project Overview

The marinas will serve as purpose-built hubs for sports fishing activities, integrating safe mooring, boat servicing, and value-added facilities. By creating focal points for the currently scattered sportfishing sector, the project enhances visitor experience, improves fish handling quality, and unlocks new income streams through charters, services, and local supply chains.

Project Objectives:

• Establish dedicated marinas for sports fishing in five selected zones

• Provide high-quality infrastructure for mooring, vessel maintenance, storage, and logistics

• Offer value-added services including accommodation, dining, gear shops, and fish processing

• Generate employment and support local businesses through a new blue economy vertical

- Restaurants, cafés, and retail for visitors and locals

•Accommodation and lodge-style rooms for sport fishing enthusiasts



3.Tourism and Economic Integration

- Charter and trip booking services
- Supply linkages with local businesses and artisans
- Platform for community-based tourism and training
